Rotational Post information and Duration	This post offers the opportunity to work in the Public Dental Service (also referred to as the Community Dental Service) in the Center for Health Science and Raigmore Hospital Dental Service in Inverness. To maximise training opportunities, the post is longitudinal, on a weekly rotation, rather than 2 x 6-month rotations.

9.	Description of training post	The DCT will alternate weekly between PDS (based in Inverness Dental Centre) and HDS in Raigmore Hospital. The DCT will undertake a range of PDS duties including domiciliary visits, management of medically compromised and special care patients, paediatric dentistry and treatment of routine patients within GDS terms and conditions. The trainee will have the opportunity to receive training in inhalation sedation; participate in regular intravenous sedation sessions, and special care and paediatric GA lists. The Raigmore component of the post offers a unique opportunity to gain experience in oral surgery where the DCT will have the opportunity to attend Dentoalveolar surgery Operating lists under GA and LA, to gain further experience, building on previous knowledge gained at DCT1 level. There is the opportunity to participate in Orthodontic clinics, where there will be the prospect to gain experience in the use of removable, functional and fixed appliances under consultant guidance. DCTs will also attend new patient diagnostic clinics.









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		You will be expected to present audits and lead discussions at the regular trainee discussion groups with fellow trainees, senior dentists and hospital staff, where you will be given evaluation which will contribute to your portfolio. The aim is to make the opportunities in the DCT1 posts in NHS Highland dynamic and tailored to suit the needs of the post-holder wherever possible. Previous post holders have taken the opportunity to be involved with clinical supervision and curriculum development in the BSc in Oral Health Sciences at the University of the Highlands and Islands or to become involved in the homeless persons dental service, and similar opportunities will be factored into your work plan where possible.

13.	Educational programme summary	There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Dental Core Trainees which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme has four themes running through each year of Dental Core Training. These are: Clinical, Communication, Career Development Skills and Quality Improvement & Patient Safety. Posts begin with a local health board and NES induction, followed by face-to-face study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events include all Dental Core Trainees in Scotland, as does the annual DCT conference. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This is predominantly to fund attendance of DCTs at the compulsory NES Educational events, however funding may be available to contribute to the cost of other courses linked to an agreed PDP. DCT posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects. All DCTs, who have not worked in an Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) unit in Scotland previously, attend an additional two-day induction course known as Maxfacts. This course is designed to cover the essential skills for an OMFS DCT post and is delivered by OMFS consultants and senior trainees. The teaching is backed up by on-line resources which will made available to DCTs prior to the Maxfacts course
