Children and Young People NES Trauma Resources

In this table we have drawn together the current provision of trauma resources and trainings available from NES Psychology Directorate for those who work with children and young people.

In addition, trauma focussed training is offered by a number of the child and young people workstreams within NES, such as specialist Child and Adolescent Mental Health (CAMHS), Training in psychological skills – Early intervention for children (TIPS-EIC) and Training in psychological skills – Paediatric healthcare (TIPS-PH) with a focus on meeting the particular needs of each workforce and the children and young people they support.
