## **Exam Support in Obstetrics and Gynaecology:** A Scottish Experience

Experiences of Preparing for the Membership Examinations of the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists from Candidates in Scotland

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## Introduction

Like most medical specialties, gaining membership of the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists is essential for progress in training.

Pass rates in Scotland have been gradually declining in recent years and are consistently below national UK average<sup>1</sup>.

• In 2022 the pass rate in Scotland was 48% compared to 72% in 2018 • In the same years UK averages were 60% and 77% respectively<sup>1</sup>.

We sought to understand the experience of candidates in Scotland and identify interventions to improve success.

## Methods

To enquire about candidate experiences, an online questionnaire was developed with oversight from the Specialty Training Board for O&G.





It comprised 43 multiple choice and free text questions to capture both quantitative and qualitative data regarding approach to, and support surrounding, exams. The questionnaire was distributed to all doctors in Scottish obstetrics and gynaecology training positions via their respective Training Program Directors.

Responses were collected anonymously using the Microsoft Forms platform and exported to Microsoft Excel for analysis.
