4.	Training unit/location/s	This 12-month post will be based at the Institute of Dentistry (Oral Surgery) and then the Aberdeen Royal Infirmary within the Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery Department. The post will be a split post with 6 months in Oral surgery and then 6 months in OMFS.

6.	Travelling commitment	There will be a requirement to travel within the NHS Grampian board area in order to obtain a range of experience.
7.	Educational Supervisor	Will be confirmed with post-holder
8.	Description of the training post	For a period of 6 months this post will be spent between the OMFS and Oral Surgery departments of the IoD at Aberdeen Royal Infirmary. The Oral Surgery department consists of 2 Consultants and 1 Speciality Dentist.
		The postholder will contribute to the delivery of specialist Oral Surgery treatment of adult and paediatric patients under GA, LA and LA with sedation.
		The postholder will have the opportunity to attend monthly Radiology MDT meetings and would be expected to contribute to departmental clinical governance and quality improvement activities.
		There will be an opportunity for the postholder to develop their knowledge, skills and behaviours as a clinical teacher and trainer by contributing to the delivery of undergraduate student extraction clinics.
		Routine outpatient clinics will be on offer with the ability to deliver 'remote consultations' to facilitate the provision of Oral surgery services across NHS Grampian.
		There is no on call commitment attached to this rotation.
		For a period of 6 months this post is based in Aberdeen Royal Infirmary within the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery which provides a Consultant Service to the Medical and Dental Practitioners of the North East of Scotland, including Moray, Orkney & Shetland, total population 630,000. The Out-Patient Department is situated within the Aberdeen

		Royal Infirmary. Current Staffing is 5 consultants, 5 specialty doctors, 1 StR, 5 DCT, 2 FY2 and 1 DCT1 grade staff. A full range of OMFS procedures are performed and access to operating under GA, LA, and LA with IV sedation is available to our patients. Routine OMFS outpatient clinics are scheduled for everyday and combined specialist clinics to discuss treatment of facial disproportion and oral rehabilitation with our orthodontic and restorative dentistry colleagues on a weekly basis. Weekly combined Head and Neck clinics are held with ENT and Oncology within the Maxillofacial department. The post holders' duties will include, attending outpatients, ward duties, attending theatre and a 1 in 5 Monday to Friday on call rota.

10.	Educational programme summary and library facilities	There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Dental Core Trainees which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme has four themes running through each year of Dental Core Training. These are: Clinical, Communication, Career Development Skills and Quality Improvement & Patient Safety. Posts begin with a local health board and NES induction, followed by a number of face-to-face study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events include all Dental Core Trainees in Scotland, as does the annual trainee conference. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP. DCT posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects. All DCTs, who have not worked in an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) unit in Scotland previously, attend an additional two-day induction course: Maxfacts. This course is designed to cover the essential skills for an OMFS DCT post and is delivered by OMFS consultants and senior trainees. The teaching is backed up by on-line resources which will made available to DCTs prior to the Maxfacts course.
