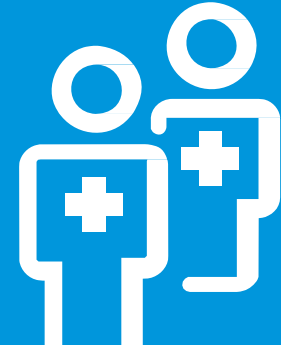


Funding for Dissertations relevant to GPN Refocussed role



NHS Education for Scotland invites nurses working in general practice to apply for reimbursement of fees for Dissertation as part of their Master's programme during financial year April 2018 – March 2019.

This funding supports General Practice Nurse role development in line with the Chief Nursing Officer's Transforming Roles programme and the National Health and Social Care Workforce Plan Part 3 (Scottish Government, 2018) enabling nurses to work in integrated teams to meet the changing health and care needs of Scotland's population.

Criteria for funding

- be employed as a nurse working in general practice
- progressing dissertation between 1st April 2018 and 31st March 2019
- dissertation topic explicitly contributes to the refocused role for General Practice Nursing (Ref : Paper 6 of Transforming roles available at <https://www.nes.scot.nhs.uk/education-and-training/by-discipline/nursing-and-midwifery/careers-and-recruitment/transforming-nmahp-roles.aspx>)
- agree to submit a 250-word summary on completion of dissertation

Include course fees paid between 1st April 2018 and 31st March 2019

Include in the Summary of Impact section of the application

- a) Dissertation Title
- b) A 50-word statement detailing how the dissertation will contribute to the refocused role of GPNs as part of Transforming Roles
