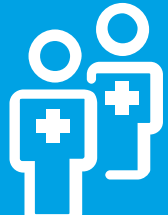


## Education and development opportunities for nurses working in General Practice teams



### **Fully-funded Courses for General Practice Nurses**

A wide range of fully-funded courses are available to book through NES PORTAL and CPD Connect. Examples include long term conditions management, cervical cytology and leadership.

### **Clinical Career Fellowships**

Clinical Career Fellowships with funded study leave, Postgraduate Diploma in Advanced Practice, Masterclasses and Action Learning for existing GPNs with 2-10 years' experience (closing date for applications 17th February 2019). Informal enquiries welcome.

### **Coaching**

Fully funded provision of coaching sessions to aid personal development for experienced GPNs.

### **Placements for Undergraduate Nurses in collaboration with NHS Boards and Universities**

Proposals are invited to provide innovative and sustainable practice placements for undergraduate students to promote General Practice as an attractive career choice.

### **Placements for Return to Practice Nurses in collaboration with NHS Boards and Universities**

Proposals are invited to provide placements for nurses who are returning to practice after a career break to maximise the potential for returners to be prepared for working in General Practice.

### **Training Places for Newly Qualified Nurses**

Proposals are invited from General Practices to offer funded training places to positively recruit Newly Qualified Nurses into General Practice. This funding supports each trainee for 20 hours per week for two years including educational preparation. Opens March 2019.
