



## REGISTRATION Open 1st August 2026 and closes on 25th September 2026

This programme:

- is aimed at pharmacists early in their career, who are in patient-focused roles to encourage them to develop knowledge, skill, values and behaviours to confidently practice in community, hospital or primary care practice
- aligns to the Royal College of Pharmacy Enhanced curriculum
- includes an independent prescribing (IP) course delivered by a Scottish university for those who do not register as an IP following FTY
- enables integration to the multidisciplinary team through the need to have collaborators from different professions review practice
- requires an Educational Supervisor to undertake regular meetings & review evidence.

### WHY JOIN?

- ✓ Provides a structured training programme
- ✓ Proven to increase confidence & competence
- ✓ Includes an IP course for those on Non-Prescriber pathway
- ✓ Provides opportunities to experience a wide variety of practice and to receive feedback on your practice.

### WHAT IS INVOLVED?

- Takes 24 months to complete (prescriber pathway)
- Evidence is developed in the workplace using supervised learning events with other healthcare professionals feeding back on/ observing your practice
- Online Educational Support sessions, clinical skills training, leadership Peer Thinking sets and face to face simulation sessions to enhance prescribing decisions
- Assessment of your portfolio by the Royal College of Pharmacy after which you will receive the credential of having completed the programme.

### NEXT STEPS

You need to:

- ✓ be qualified and on the GPhC register (IP or non-IP)
- ✓ be employed & have agreement from your employer
- ✓ have an Educational Supervisor before registering
