



# BUILDING A DIGITAL MINDSET IN OUR SENIOR LEADERS



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The Leading in the Digital Age Digital Mindset Programme is commissioned by Scottish Government and COSLA to support Scotland's Digital Health and Care Strategy and Delivery Plan. It has been specifically designed to support Scotland's senior leaders to:

- Have the confidence and knowledge to lead and support the transformation of health and social care services in the digital age
- Be able to inform, question and challenge through a digital lens
- Understand how we put people at the heart of designing services
- Adopt a digital mindset to see possibilities to transform services through technology as an enabler

## Method:

The content was developed using cross-sector expertise and consists of three elements:

1. An asynchronous 45 minute video (Part 1) which provides context, introduces concepts and case studies, followed by
2. A 2.5 to 3 hour live, interactive, online session (Part 2) held on Teams for a maximum of 8 participants from mixed health and social care settings
3. A wide range of resources consisting of key texts, commentaries, and talking heads from digital leaders and subject matter experts.

The content is rooted in the principles of the Scottish Approach to Service Design and welcomes those with any level of existing digital expertise to attend. Its primary purpose is to make digital part of everyone's conversation, and not the responsibility of the few, breaking down silos and helping participants to form a shared understanding of digital in the process.

## Result:

170 board-level leaders (since November 2023) and 100 senior leaders (since ) have now attended a session and have shared the impact with us in evaluation surveys, including their own leadership calls to action. Sessions continue to run with excellent uptake from across the sector.

## Conclusion:

Transformation is increasingly being placed at the top of organisations' agendas which is why it is so critical that senior leaders adopt a digital mindset in order to support, deliver and set strategies which enable the transformation of services, using technology as an enabler.

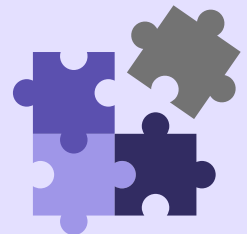
