4.	Training unit/location/s	This post is based within both NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde and NHS Lanarkshire Health Boards. Six months is based at the Hunter Health Centre PDS, East Kilbride then six months at Glasgow Dental Hospital (GDH)

6.	Travelling commitment	There will be a requirement to travel within NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde and NHS Lanarkshire Board area in order to obtain a range of experience.

8.	Description of the training post	<p>The DCT1 will undertake a range of PDS duties from September 2023 to March 2024. The PDS element may include, but is not restricted to, dental inspection of schools, domiciliary care, care of patients who have additional needs or require special care, and paediatric dentistry. There will also be opportunities to receive training in inhalation sedation and may be opportunities to participate in GA lists.</p> <p>The second part of the post at GDH will commence in March 2024 through to August 2024. The Oral Surgery department at Glasgow Dental Hospital and School offers a broad range of clinical activities and experience in the following; consultant clinics, minor Oral surgery sessions, supervision and clinical teaching of BDS students, management of emergency patients and experience in either sedation sessions or theatre lists at non base hospital sites. There is a regular Oral Surgery journal club, at which DCTs are expected to present, to benefit from appraisal by senior staff.</p>
9.	Primary Care training element	In this post the DCT1 will work for six months in the PDS. You therefore need to be eligible for an NHS list number.
10.	Educational programme summary and library facilities	There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Dental Core Trainees which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme has four themes running through each year of Dental Core Training. These are: Clinical, Communication, Career Development Skills and Quality Improvement & Patient Safety. Posts begin with a local health board and NES induction, followed by a number of

		face-to-face study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events include all Dental Core Trainees in Scotland, as does the annual trainee conference. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP. DCT posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.
