Empowering Care : Dental Nurse Special Care Training Enhancing skills inclusive, compassionate, dental care


Introduction

The National Examining Board for Dental Nurses (NEBDN) Certificate in Special Care Dental Nursing programme is a post registration qualification delivered online by Health Education and Improvement Wales (HEIW). This programme is run for registered dental nurses who help to care for people whose health and social needs may require special oral health care provision.

Objectives of the Training:


On successfully gaining the NEBDN Certificate in Special Care Dental Nursing the learner will be able to:

- Demonstrate an understanding of the role of the special care dental nurse.
- Apply the recommendations of best practice in special care dentistry.
- Apply the principles of the Equality Act 2010 and other legislation/regulations and work within these frameworks.
- Understand the impact of illness, disability, and medically compromising conditions on general and oral health.
- Encourage and demonstrate effective oral health care with appropriate aids and adaptations relevant to the patients' needs.
- Demonstrate the use of different methods of supporting individuals during oral health care including the use of adjuncts.
- Understand the range of controls for pain and anxiety techniques.
- Empathise with patients and demonstrate an ability to communicate effectively with patients, parents, carers, and colleagues.
- Explain the concept of multidisciplinary care of patients and teamwork.
- Remain calm, decisive, and purposeful whilst handling difficulties or complications.
- Recognise their own limitations, reflect on experiences, and appreciate the need for continuing professional development.
