Privacy Policy

This Privacy Policy applies to information we, The General Nursing Council for Scotland (Education) Fund 1983 and Margaret Callum Rodger Midwifery Award collect about individuals who interact with our organisation. It explains what personal information we collect and how we use it.

Personal Data that we process

The following table explains the types of data we collect and the legal basis, under current data protection legislation, on which this data is processed.

Purpose	Data (key elements)	Basis
Enquiring about our organisation and its work	Name, email, message	Legitimate interests - it is necessary for us to read and store your message so that we can respond in the way that you would expect.
Subscribing to distribution list and updates about our work	Name, email, address	Consent - you have given your active consent.
Applications for GNC Funding	Name, Email, Address, workplace, NMC Registration, job title, phone number	For assessing and awarding grant funding
Website functionality	Website activity collected through cookies	Legitimate interests - it is necessary for us to store a small amount of information, usually through cookies, to deliver functionality that you would expect, such as remembering the contents of your communications before you have fully completed the process.

How we use your data

We will only use your data in a manner that is appropriate considering the basis on which that data was collected, as set out in the table at the top of this policy.

For example, we may use your personal information to:

- reply to enquiries you send to us;
- where you have specifically agreed to this, send communications by email

relating to our work, your application, reporting and other business intelligence which we think may be of interest to you.

- processing your GNC Funding Applications;
 - All application forms are stored securely in line with NHS Education for Scotland information governance policy. Applicants are asked to confirm agreement to this using the NES consent form that accompanies the application form.

When we share your data

- Application forms and personal information are shared only with the General Nursing Council for Scotland (Education) Fund 1983 and Margaret Callum Rodger Midwifery project team and members of the team's disbursement panel for purposes of assessment of applications against acceptance criteria.
- Successful applicant's name, role, workplace, email address and learning activity detail (except financial detail) will be shared with your organisation's Practice Learning Lead. This will ensure support, coordination and raising awareness of your learning and its impact on patient/client care at a strategic level. All personal information will be held and used in accordance with GDPR principles and policy.

We will only pass your data to third parties in the following circumstances:

- you have provided your explicit consent for us to pass data to a named third party;
- we are using a third party purely for the purposes of processing data on our behalf and we have in place a data processing agreement with that third party that fulfils our legal obligations in relation to the use of third-party data processors; or
- we are required by law to share your data.

In addition, we will only pass data to third parties outside of the EU where appropriate safeguards are in place as defined by Article 46 of the General Data Protection Regulation.

How long we keep your data

We take the principles of data minimisation and removal seriously and have internal policies in place to ensure that we only ever ask for the minimum amount of data for the associated purpose and delete that data promptly once it is no longer required.

We only keep your information for as long as is necessary to fulfil the purposes for which the personal information is collected. This includes for the purposes of meeting any legal, accounting or other reporting requirements or obligations.

Rights you have over your data

You have a range of rights over your data, which include the following:

- Where data processing is based on consent, you may revoke this consent at any time, and we will make it as easy as possible for you to do this;
- You have the right to ask for rectification and/or deletion of your information;
- You have the right of access to your information;
- You have the right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner if you feel your rights have been infringed.

However, where possible we will always try to allow the maximum access to your rights while continuing to deliver as many services to you as possible.

Cookies and Usage Tracking

A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers that is downloaded on to your computer when you visit a website. Cookies are used by many websites and can do several things, e.g. remembering your preferences and counting the number of people looking at a website.

Where cookies are used to collect personal data, we list these purposes in the table above, along with other personal data that we collect. However, we also use some cookies that do not collect personal information but that do help us collect anonymous information about how people use our website. We use Google Analytics for this purpose. Google Analytics generates statistical and other information about website usage by means of cookies, which are stored on users' computers. The information collected by Google Analytics about usage of our website is not personally identifiable.
